YORK - York Sewer District Superintendent Tim Haskell has received the Charles Perry Award for "excellence in operations and maintenance of wastewater collection systems."

The Maine WasteWater Control Association presented Haskell with the award Sept. 13 at its Fall Maine WasteWater Control Association Convention. The award recognizes industry professionals who exhibit extra effort, originality and excellence in management, operations, and maintenance of collection systems in Maine, according to a released statement by Haskell.

Also during the awards ceremony at the convention, the state Department of Environmental Protection presented the York Sewer District with a Certificate of Achievement for 2012 to recognize 11 years of continuous improvement in all aspects of the district's operations.

In a 2001 DEP review of the facility, a number of items were identified to be addressed. With the support and commitment of the board of trustees, the staff of the district has continually and proactively upgraded components, Haskell said. District staff members also were recognized for their pride and enthusiasm that they exhibit managing the district's facilities, and their sharing of knowledge with others in the industry.
